Course Descriptions

Emergency Medical Technology I

Course Number: IP212X0

Hours of Instruction: 135

Prerequisite: Tenth Grade English

This course is aligned to the EMT Basic certification available from the North Carolina Office of Emergency Medical Services and is part I of a two course sequence require to meet the mandatory hours of training. The course includes skills in each area, using resources from the community to help deliver instruction to the students. Work-based learning strategies appropriate for this course include job shadowing. SkillsUSA competitive events, community service, and leadership activities provide the opportunity to apply essential standards and workplace readiness skills through authentic experiences.

Emergency Medical Technology II

Course Number: IP225X0

Hours of Instruction: 135

Prerequisite: Emergency Medical Technology I

This course is aligned to the EMT Basic certification available from the North Carolina Office of Emergency Medical Services and is part II of a two course sequence require to meet the mandatory hours of training. The course includes skills in each area, using resources from the community to help deliver instruction to the students. English language arts are reinforced. Work-based learning strategies appropriate for this course include job shadowing. Apprenticeship and cooperative education are possible for this course (age limits may apply). SkillsUSA competitive events, community service, and leadership activities provide the opportunity to apply essential standards and workplace readiness skills through authentic experiences. Students will have to complete 24 hours of ride time in an ambulance.

The EMT I & EMT II are two separate courses that are taken sequentially, (EMT I & EMT II have to be taken the same school year, NOT EMT I Junior year and EMT II Senior year) to meet the mandatory hours of training by the NCOEMS. So the course is two semesters long with 2 semesters of credit.

The course will meet the WCPSS "drop - add" period of the first 10 days of the school year. All WCPSS high school Rules and Policies will apply (Absentee, Code of Conduct, Dress etc.).
